#### **RESEARCH TURNING SPORT INTO SOCIAL CHANGE**



# **STUDY 1:** MOTIVATION, SATISFACTION, AND DESTINATION PERCEPTION

This study will evaluate participants' motivation and perceptions of service quality at the 2025 CSIT World Sports Games, examining their impact on participant satisfaction, destination image (Loutraki, Greece), revisit intentions, and wellbeing.

Method: Questionnaire - quantitative - statistics



# **STUDY 2:** WELL-BEING OUTCOMES AT THE 2025 GAMES

This study will evaluate the outcomes of various forms of well-being among participants at the 2025 CSIT World Sports Games. Specifically, we will determine the strength of psychological, subjective, occupational, and social well-being based on participants' experiences at the Games and on their job engagement, creativity, motivation, and job satisfaction.

Method: Questionnaire - quantitative - statistics



#### **STUDY 4: TEAM DYNAMICS AND ORGANIZATIONAL COMMITMENT**

This study will explore how social interactions and team dynamics during the 2025 CSIT World Sports Games impact employees' organizational commitment.


Method: Interviews - qualitative
